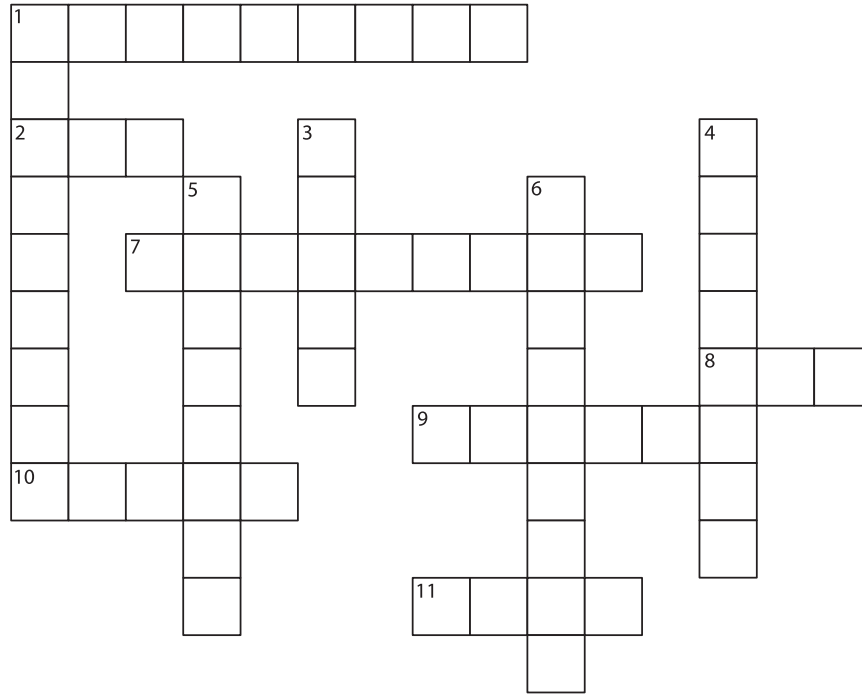


On With the Show Crossword
